is an AI-powered conversational search engine that provides real-time, accurate answers with citations

Instrumentl <<https://www.instrumentl.com/>>

helps users identify relevant funders, track and manage funding opportunities, and stay on top of deadlines.

CharityGPT <<https://www.charitygpt.io/>>

is a specialized tool for donor management, personalized communication, and administrative efficiency. It assists in drafting fundraising content, analyzing data, and automating supporter engagement

DonorSearch <<https://www.donorsearch.net/>>

is a leading AI-driven prospect research and wealth screening tool for nonprofits, helping identify high-capacity donors through data analytics

ChatGPT <<https://chatgpt.com/>>

is a conversational generative AI chatbot developed by OpenAI that uses large language models to generate human-like text, code, and images

Maggie Ewan - NGCP (she/her): I am going to paste a Grant Solicitation. Please act as a senior grant consultant and provide:

A 3-sentence summary of the program.

The maximum grant amount and the deadline.

A list of all required attachments.

Any eligibility restrictions (e.g., geographic or organizational type)."

Yes! And confirm that any scientific papers you may want to cite are real. Hallucinated references would be a huge red flag in a proposal.

Tracy Yassini, EmpowHer: ChatGPT is much better with tables/budgets, Claude.ai learns your voice and doesn't have typical AI patterns.

Debra Sabo: if funding by an organization has done only a handful of grants, is AI less valuable?

Maria Webster: I find that AI does not count characters correctly.

It can still be helpful to reduce wording, but you have to verify. It can help to remind it to count punctuation and spaces.

Anita Lyndaker-Studer: Replying to "I find that AI does ..." "

With the word count, I have to specifically say less than certain # of characters... for some reason likes that language better

Frances McIntire-Freeman: When I have experienced more than I need word or character count and it would change for me

Frances McIntire-Freeman: I have seen a small few who have asked to be transparent about using it to make sure it is use only as a tool for corrections

Rebecca Singer Full STEAM Forward: Do you have any thoughts on the importance of adding citations to proposal? If we write "Studies have shown..." do we have to cite the study? Asking because, with strict character counts, citations can take up valuable space.

Kristen Dean: I usually keep a list of citations in case the funder asks for my sources, unless explicitly requested in the application instructions.
